

Quick Facts

- Duration: 2015-2020
- Priority Sectors: Health & Education
- Coverage: 10 aimags + 3 UB districts
- Trust Fund: CHF 2.5 million contribution, SDC

Overall goal: Citizens in poor localities have increased access to public decision-making processes and quality services through social accountability.





Introduction and Application of HLP

- Between 2018-2019, The World Bank with assistance from SDC and LOGIN organized three HLP workshops to introduce HLP in primary education and primary health sector for mainstreaming social accountability.
- A Resource Pool for HLP has been formed, consisting of 10 professionals from various sectors in Mongolia.
- Over 10 local HLP workshops were organized with local initiative and resources; and participated by approximately 5000 stakeholder representatives.
- 10 exposure visits were organized by MASAM's subproject implementers and other interested service providers to see 10 good practices.







- and documented in three Good Practice Compendiums. Also, the HLP step-by-step guidance/handbook was developed based on the experience.

National Level Policy Results

- Advanced Government M&E system through CSS
 - Reflecting Citizens Satisfaction Survey results in policy planning and implementation in 21 aimags and MUB through Service Improvement Follow-up Action Plans (budgeted)
 - Creation of CSS index to evaluate sub-national government performance
- Integration of SA in sectoral policies
 - Guideline for parents' engagement in school affairs by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Science and Sports (March 3, 2019, is the (A/119)
 - Action plan including replication of SA projects by Ministry of Health in 2019



"Inspired" local rollout efforts





Early stock-taking/Online survey in 2019 reported several immediate results such as:

- A Special month for Good practice in health services and local visits between Gobisumber and Zavkhan provinces
- A voluntary training for civil servants in Darkhan-Uul Province, in May 2019



What has happened beyond MASAM (2020-present)

- National Academy of Governance (under the Cabinet Secretariat of Mongolia):
 - The experienced and committed pool of trainers and authors of the HLP handbook
 - Integrated HLP to its official short-term training, under its Professional Development Institute, (2021-2022)
 - In March 2022, State-owned enterprises ordered and received HLP training for thermos power engineers (70 participants)
- **SDC and GIZ co-financed a project** on Public Investment in Energy Efficiency Phase 2":
 - SDC supported co-financing through local authorities for the thermo-retrofitting of 36 public buildings (schools and kindergartens) as a model for replication.
 - Peer learning workshops and Bus trips were organized among kindergartens.
- **UNICEF's project** on early child health and protection:
 - Applied HLP to disseminate its program results to 25 kindergartens in Bayarzurkh district in 2023
- **WB**: Third Sustainable Livelihood Project (SLP3):
 - Preparing to share its Local Development Fund (LDF) results in October 2023 among local authorities of 21 aimag (330 soum/villages)
